To the extent that any of the terms or conditions contained in this Third Amendment may contradict with any of the terms or conditions of the attached Agreement, the First Amendment or the Second Amendment ("Agreement"), it is expressly understood and agreed that the terms of this Third Amendment shall take precedence and supersede the attached Agreement. The parties agree to amend the Contract by adding the following language:

1. **Purpose of Amendment.** This Amendment shall constitute the Amendment to the Agreement between the District and the Contractor. The purpose of this Amendment is to amend the terms and deliverables between the District and Contractor.

2. Term of Agreement.

2.1. At the conclusion of the term dated September 1, 2025 as outlined in 1.1 of the Agreement, the District and Contractor elect to extend the term of the Agreement beginning on September 2, 2025, through August 31, 2026.

- 3.2. Replace Exhibit A with Contractor's Product Description and Data Elements of District Data or PII that Bloomsight Collects, Generates, or Uses hereby attached to this Third Amendment and made part of this Agreement.
- 3.3. Exhibit B is deleted hereby in its entirety.
- 3.4. Replace Exhibit B with Contractor's Bloomsight Annual Subscription, hereby attached to this Third Amendment and made part of this Agreement.
- 3.5. The pricing of all Services under this Agreement shall not exceed and as set forth on the attached Exhibit B.
- 3.6. Exhibit C is deleted hereby in its entirety.
- 3.7. Replace Exhibit C with Contractor's Bloomsight Accessibility Conformance Report, hereby attached to this Third Amendment and made part of this Agreement.
- 3.8. Section 10, Insurance is deleted hereby in its entirety.

3.9. Add Exhibit D with Poudre School District's Tech Services with PII Insurance Requirements hereby attached to this Third Amendment and made part of this Agreement.

4. Special Provisions.

4.1. <u>Terms and Conditions.</u> With the exception of items explicitly delineated in this Amendment, all terms and conditions of the original Agreement between the District and Contractor shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

5. General Provisions.

- 5.1. **Entire Agreement.** The original Agreement, the First Amendment, Second Amendment and this Third Amendment constitute the entire agreement of the parties regarding the subject matter addressed herein and supersedes all prior agreements, whether oral or written, pertaining to said subject matter.
- 5.2. <u>Signatures.</u> This Agreement may be executed and delivered via portable document format (pdf), and the pdf signature of any party shall be considered valid, binding, effective and an original for all purposes.

SOFTWARE SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN BLOOMSIGHTS US LLC AND POUDRE SCHOOL DISTRICT R-1

This Software Services Agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into this 3rd day of May 2022, by and between Poudre School District R-1 (the "District") and Bloomsights US LLC (the "Contractor"). The District and the Contractor are collectively referenced herein as the "parties." Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual agreements set forth herein, the District and the Contractor agree as follows:

1. Term of Agreement.

- 1.1. This Agreement shall commence on September 1, 2022 and continue through and including August 31, 2023, unless earlier terminated as provided herein. The Agreement, at the option of the District, may be extended for up to four (4) additional one-year terms.
- 1.2. Notwithstanding any other term or provision of this Agreement, the District's obligations hereunder are expressly subject to its budgeting and appropriation of sufficient funds for each fiscal year (July 1 June 30) the Agreement is in effect. In no event, shall the District's obligations under the Agreement constitute a multiple-fiscal year direct or indirect debt or other financial obligation under Article X, Section 20(4)(b) of the Colorado Constitution.
- 1.3. Notwithstanding the original term of the Agreement and/or any extensions thereof as provided in section 1.1 and 1.2 above, the District may terminate the Agreement at any time in its sole discretion for any reason, with or without cause, upon written notice served on the Contractor no less than thirty (30) days prior to the date of termination.

2. Deliverables and Purchase Price.

- 2.1. The Contractor shall make its Bloomsights web-based digital school climate assessment tool available for use in the District's schools, in accordance with the scope of work set forth in the attached Exhibit A (hereinafter the "Services").
- 2.2. The total cost for Services as set forth on the attached Exhibit B is Three Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$3,000.00), due and payable by the District within thirty (30) days of receipt of Contractor's invoice.
- 2.3. **Rates.** Fulfillment of Services under the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement shall be exclusively through the issuance of a District purchase order.
 - 2.3.1 Quotes for services will be requested by the contact in section 9 of this Agreement, department and school based requests for quotes shall not be processed by the Contractor.

- 2.3.1.1 Contractor's quotes shall include dates of Service conforming to section 1.1 of this Agreement, per license type cost rate, and District location.
- 2.3.2 Site-based credit cards and/or site-based restricted checks shall not be permitted for payment.
- 2.3.3 Services provided by Contractor without conforming to section 2.4 of the Agreement shall be considered unauthorized and payment shall not be issued by the District.
- 2.4 <u>Tax Exemption.</u> The District is exempt from federal and state taxes under Colorado Tax Exempt Number 98-03335.
 - 2.4.1 Contractor shall assure compliance with the District Policy DJG/DJGA, attached as Exhibit C and hereby made part of this Agreement, direct communication with schools or sales must be approved by contact in section 9 of this agreement.
- 2.5 <u>Invoicing</u> Contractor will provide invoices for the Services at a rate not to exceed those specified in Exhibit B. Invoices shall be submitted to the District's Accounts Payable Department within thirty (30) days from receipt of Purchase Order. Invoices for Services shall include name of provider, dates of Services conforming to section 1.1, location for Services and a description of the Services provided.
 - 2.5.1 Invoices received from the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement will be reviewed and approved by the District's representative, indicating that services have been rendered in conformity with the Agreement and then will be sent to the Finance Department for payment. Invoices will generally be paid within thirty (30) days following the District representative's approval.
 - 2.5.2 Invoices which do not conform with the agreement will be paid thirty (30) days from receipt of a revised and corrected invoice.
 - 2.5.3 All invoices must be submitted within 30 days of fiscal year end June 30 and may not include items received by the District outside of the fiscal year July 1 June 30.
 - 2.5.4 Invoices shall be sent to ap@psdschools.org.
- 2.6 Additional District schools may participate in Services under all terms and conditions specified within this Agreement. This Agreement in no way binds the District or District Schools to exclusive use of Contractor's Services. Discretion to utilize Services is under the direction of each District School Principal or Principal designee. District Principals or Principal designee will adhere to applicable laws, regulations, and District policies.

- 2.7 The Contractor grants the District a non-exclusive, non-transferable, non-sublicenseable license to access and use, and permit authorized users to access and use the Services solely in the United States during the term of the Agreement.
- 2.8 The District shall access and use the Services solely for non-commercial instructional and administrative purposes within the District. Further, the District shall not, except as expressly authorized or directed by the Contractor: (a) copy, modify, translate, distribute, disclose or create derivative works based on the contents of, or sell, the Services, or any part thereof; (b) decompile, disassemble or otherwise reverse engineer Services or otherwise use the Services to develop functionally similar products or services; (c) modify, alter or delete any of the copyright, trademark, or other proprietary notices in or on the Services; (d) rent, lease or lend the Services or use the Services for the benefit of any third party; (e) avoid, circumvent or disable any security or digital rights management device, procedure, protocol or mechanism in the Services; or (f) permit any authorized user or third party to do any of the foregoing. The District also agrees that any works created in violation of this section 2.7 are derivative works, and, as such, the District agrees to assign, and hereby assigns, all right, title and interest therein to the Contractor.
- 2.9 The District agrees, subject to the limited rights expressly granted hereunder, that all rights, title and interest in and to all Services, including all related IP Rights, are and shall remain the sole and exclusive property of Contractor or its third-party licensors. "IP Rights" means, collectively, rights under patent, trademark, copyright and trade secret laws, and any other intellectual property or proprietary rights recognized in any country or jurisdiction worldwide. The District shall notify Contractor of any violation of Contractor's IP Rights in the Services, and shall reasonably assist Contractor as necessary to remedy any such violation. Contractor Services are protected by patents.
- 2.10 The District understands and agrees that its students' access to and use of the Contractor's web-based system under this Agreement requires that it disclose confidential student records and information, as that term is defined below, to the Contractor. The Contractor understands and agrees that if it fails to comply with any of the requirements under sections 4, 5, 6 or 7 below at any time during or after the term of this Agreement the District may, as applicable, terminate the Agreement and/or disqualify the Contractor from future agreements with the District.

3 Definitions.

3.3 As used in this Agreement, "personally identifiable information" is defined as information (including metadata) that, alone or in combination, is linked or linkable to a specific student so as to allow a reasonable person in the school community, who does not have personal knowledge of the relevant circumstances, to identify the student with reasonable certainty. Personally identifiable information includes but is not limited to: (a) the student's name; (b) the name of the student's parent or other family members; (c) the address or phone number of the student or student's family; (d) personal identifiers such as the student's social security number, student number or biometric record; and (e) indirect identifiers such as the student's date of birth, place of birth or mother's maiden name.

- 3.4 As used in this Agreement, "education records" is defined as records, files, documents and other materials that: (a) contain information directly related to a student; and (b) are maintained by the District, or by a party acting for the District such as the Contractor.
- 3.5 As used in this Agreement, "confidential student records and information" is defined as education records and personally identifiable information concerning District students, including but not limited to confidential student records and information disclosed to, collected by and/or generated by the Contractor. Confidential student records and information does not include "de-identified confidential student records and information," as defined in section 3.5 below.
- 3.6 As used in this Agreement, "collect" is defined as the gathering of data and other information by any means, including but not limited to the use of logs, cookies, tracking pixels, etc.
- 3.7 As used in this Agreement, "de-identified confidential student records and information" is defined as confidential student records and information from which all personally identifiable information, and the ability to determine any personally identifiable information, is removed.
- 3.8 As used in this Agreement, "securely destroy" is defined as removing confidential student records and information from the Contractor's systems, paper files, hard-copy and electronic records, databases and any other media regardless of format, in accordance with the standard detailed in the National Institute of Standards and Technology ("NIST") SP 800-88 Guidelines for Media Sanitization, so that the confidential student records and information are permanently irretrievable in the Contractor's normal course of business.
- 3.9 As used in this Agreement, "eligible student" is defined as a student who is at least 18 years of age or who is legally emancipated.
- Ownership of Confidential Student Records and Information. All confidential student records and information shall remain the exclusive property of the District and all rights, title and interest in the confidential student records and information, including but not limited to intellectual property rights in the confidential student records and information, belong to and are retained solely by the District. The District hereby grants to the Contractor a limited, nonexclusive license to access, view, collect, generate and use confidential student records and information solely for the purpose of performing its obligations under this Agreement.

5 Security of Confidential Student Records and Information.

5.3 The Contractor shall store and process confidential student records and information in accordance with commercial best practices, including implementing appropriate administrative, physical and technical safeguards that are no less rigorous than those outlined in CIS Critical Security Controls, as amended, to secure such confidential student records and information from unauthorized access, disclosure, alteration and use. The Contractor shall ensure that all such safeguards, including the manner in which confidential student records and information is collected, accessed, used, stored, processed, disposed of and disclosed, comply

with all applicable federal and state data protection and privacy laws, regulations and directives, including but not limited to Colorado's Student Data Transparency and Security Act, C.R.S. §§ 22-16-101 to -112. Without limiting the foregoing, and unless expressly agreed to the contrary in writing, the Contractor warrants that all electronic confidential student records and information will be encrypted in transmission and at rest in accordance with NIST Special Publication 800-57, as amended.

5.4 The Contractor shall conduct periodic risk assessments and remediate any identified security vulnerabilities in a timely manner. The Contractor shall promptly notify the District in the event of: (a) any security or privacy breach concerning confidential student records and information; and/or (b) any use or disclosure of student personally identifiable information not authorized under this Agreement.

6 Use of Confidential Student Records and Information.

- 6.3 Under the Agreement, Contractor may access, view, collect, generate and/or use confidential student records and information only under the following terms and conditions: (a) except as provided in section 6.2 below, Contractor shall not disclose confidential student records and information, in whole or in part, to any other party; (b) Contractor shall not use any confidential student records or information to advertise or market to students or their parents/guardians; (c) Contractor shall access, view, collect, generate and use confidential student records and information only to the extent necessary to perform its obligations under the Agreement; and (d) at the conclusion of the term of the Agreement the Contractor shall, as directed by the District, either securely destroy all confidential student records and information in its possession, custody or control, or return such confidential student records and information to the District.
- Contract disclose confidential student records and information to its subcontractor that hosts and maintains its web-based platform (hereinafter "Subcontractor") as set forth in Exhibit A. Subcontractor, pursuant to written subcontracts specifying the purpose of the disclosure and providing that: (a) Subcontractor shall not disclose confidential student records and information, in whole or in part, to any other party; (b) Subcontractor shall not use any confidential student records or information to advertise or market to students or their parents/guardians; (c) Subcontractor shall access, view, collect, generate and use confidential student records and information only to the extent necessary to assist Contractor in performing its obligations under the Agreement; and (d) at the conclusion of their work under their subcontracts Subcontractor shall, as directed by the District through the Contractor, either securely destroy all confidential student records and information in their possession, custody or control, or return such confidential student records and information to the District.
- 6.5 Contractor may use de-identified confidential student records and information for purposes of research, the improvement of its products and services, and/or the development of new products and services. In no event, shall the Contractor re-identify or attempt to re-identify any de-identified confidential student records and information.

- 6.6 Contractor, on behalf of itself and its Subcontractor, shall promptly furnish to the District upon request all confidential student records and information they have collected and/or generated and not in the District's possession. Such requests may include but shall not be limited to those made in order to respond to parent/guardian and eligible student requests to inspect and review education records as authorized under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1232g ("FERPA") and/or under the Colorado Open Records Act, C.R.S. §§ 24-72-200.1 et seq. ("CORA"). The District, not the Contractor, shall respond to all parent/guardian and eligible student requests to inspect and review records, data and other information.
- School Service Contract Provider. If Contractor is a "school service contract provider" under the Colorado Student Data Transparency and Security Act (the "Act"), the Agreement is amended to add the language in this section 7. Under the Act, a "school service contract provider" is defined as an entity (other than the Colorado Department of Education, a K-12 public education entity or an institution of higher education) that enters into a formal, negotiated contract with the District to provide a "school service." Under the Act, a "school service" is defined as an Internet website, online service, online application or mobile application that: (a) is designed and marketed primarily for use in a preschool, elementary school or secondary school; (b) is used at the direction of District teachers or other District employees; and (c) collects, maintains or uses confidential student records and information.
- 7.3 As a school service contract provider under the Act, the Contractor has provided the following information the attached Exhibit A: (a) the data elements of confidential student records and information that Contractor collects under the Agreement, regardless of whether the data elements are initially collected or ultimately held individually or in the aggregate using protocols that are effective for preserving the anonymity of each student included in the data; (b) the learning purpose for which Contractor collects the confidential student records and information; and (c) how the Contractor uses and shares the confidential student records and information. Contractor shall update this information as necessary to maintain accuracy.
- 7.4 Contractor shall facilitate the District's access to and correction of any factually inaccurate confidential student records and information as required in response to correction requests from parents/guardians and eligible students.
- Remedies. If Contractor or Subcontractors fail to comply with any of the foregoing requirements in sections 4, 5, 6 or 7 at any time during or after the term of the Agreement the District may, as applicable, terminate the Agreement and/or disqualify Contractor and any one or more of Subcontractors from future contracts and subcontracts with the District. Excluding any data breach, the District may allow an opportunity to cure a breach within thirty (30) days of written notice.
- 9 Notices and Communications. All notices and communications required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be: (a) sent via certified mail, return receipt requested and postage prepaid, to the address of the other party set forth below; or (b) sent via e-mail to the other party via the e-mail address set forth below.

Contractor shall procure and maintain the required insurance specified below for the duration of this Agreement, which insurance shall be written for not less than the amounts specified or greater if required by law. The District's receipt of a Certificate of Insurance from the Contractor with limits and or coverages that do not meet the requirements does not waive the requirements and the Contractor shall still be responsible for the limits and coverages stated in this Agreement. Specified coverages and amounts may be provided by a combination of a primary policy plus an umbrella or following form excess policy. All insurance shall be with a carrier licensed in the state of Colorado and shall have a minimum A.M. Best rating of A- VII. Contractor shall furnish the District's Director of Records and Risk Management with certificates of the required insurance prior to the District's approval and signing of this Agreement, and with renewal certificates prior to the expiration of any required insurance that expires during the term of this Agreement. The insurance requirements specified in this section 10 shall not reduce the indemnification liability that Contractor has assumed in section 11.

- 13.3 **No Assignment.** The Contractor shall not assign this Agreement or any of its rights, interests or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the District, which consent may be withheld for any reason or no reason as determined by the District in its sole discretion.
- 13.4 **No Waiver.** The parties agree that no assent or waiver, express or implied, to any breach of any one or more of the covenants of this Agreement shall be construed as or deemed to be an assent to or a waiver of any subsequent breach.

- 13.5 <u>Amendment or Modification.</u> No amendment or modification of this Agreement shall be valid unless set forth in writing and executed by the District and the Contractor through written amendments to the Agreement, in the same manner and with the same formality as was done for this Agreement

- 13.9 **No Third-Party Beneficiary.** Enforcement of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, and all rights of action relating to such enforcement, shall be strictly reserved to the District and the Contractor. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall give or allow any claim or right of action whatsoever by any third person other than the District or the Contractor. It is the express intent of the parties that any third person receiving services or benefits pursuant to this Agreement shall be deemed an incidental beneficiary only.
- 13.10 <u>Binding Arbitration Prohibited.</u> The District does not agree to binding arbitration by any extra-judicial body or person. Any provision to the contrary is null and void.
- 13.11 <u>Attorney Fees and Costs.</u> In the event it becomes necessary for either party to institute litigation to enforce any provision of this Agreement, the substantially prevailing party in such litigation shall receive, as part of any judgment or award entered, its reasonable attorney fees and costs, including expert witness fees.
- 13.12 **<u>Binding Effect.</u>** This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective heirs, legal representatives, successors and permitted assigns.
- 13.13 <u>Headings.</u> The headings used in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall have no effect upon the construction or interpretation of this Agreement.
- 13.14 **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement of the parties regarding the subject matter addressed herein and supersedes all prior Agreements, whether oral or written, pertaining to said subject matter.
- 13.15 <u>Signatures.</u> This Agreement may be executed and delivered via portable document format (pdf), and the pdf signature of any party shall be considered valid, binding,

effective and an original for all purposes. This Agreement may be signed in counterparts, and each counterpart shall be deemed an original, and all the counterparts taken as a whole shall constitute one and the same instrument.

Overview

Bloomsights is an innovative, student-oriented digital tool that supports school wide efforts to assess school climate and promote student well-being. Bloomsights adaptive survey technology makes it safe and easy for students to share their experiences of school life and reflect on their relationships with their peers and teachers over the course of the school year. Student responses are automatically analyzed using the latest in social and emotional development research and delivered to staff in real-time. These valuable insights provide staff with key metrics of school climate and student well-being tailored to their class and students. Developed by teachers and psychologists, Bloomsights is designed to facilitate deeper communication across all key stakeholders and foster stronger, more inclusive, and happier school communities.

Detailed Description of Bloomsights

Bloomsights is a web-based application for students in grades K-8 and is designed to work on all browsers and devices. Using the most current social and emotional development research, Bloomsights helps schools accurately identify which aspects of school life are positive and need reinforcement and which aspects are negative and should be changed. Additionally, Bloomsights highlights areas of student social and emotional strengths and weaknesses.

Bloomsights includes both a student and teacher experience. Students use their personal user account to sign in to Bloomsights and respond to a set of evidence-based survey questions. Each session is broken into two parts: My Opinion and My Classmates. In My Opinion, students respond to questions that measure how safe, engaged, connected, and supported they feel at school. In My Classmates, students respond to questions that point to their relationships with their peers.

We suggest that students sign in to Bloomsights at home or in the classroom every four to six weeks and spend 5 to 15 minutes to complete their session. However, we have built Bloomsights to allow students to sign in anytime based on unique needs and change their responses to reflect their most current attitudes and opinions. Students do not need to complete a session for every class/teacher they have. Their responses will automatically be shared based on their class schedule

Teachers also use their personal user account to sign in to Bloomsights. Once they are signed in, they are taken to their class page where they can see the results of their student's session in real time and over the course of the school year at the class, student, and category level. Teachers with multiple sections/classes can select the results they want to see from a drop down menu.

We suggest that teachers assign Bloomsights as homework at a constant interval over the course of the school year. This way Bloomsights does not interfere with instructional time and allows schools to monitor patterns of school climate and student well-being over time. Since we allow students to sign in anytime and use adaptive survey technology, it is expected that students will have different amounts of questions to respond to for each session.

Staff access to Bloomsights varies depending on each schools needs. For this reason, we made it possible for schools to customize access rights based on their individual needs.

What is Poudre School District Buying?

Bloomsights adaptive survey technology

Bloomsights evidence-based survey includes key learning and health-related questions that point to four key components of school climate and student well-being: School Safety, Teaching and Learning, Relationships, and School Environment. Our adaptive technology controls the frequency of the questions that students will be asked to make sure students are shown the most relevant questions. Additionally, Bloomsights questions are progressively revealed to students in small numbers over the course of the course of the school year to protect against survey fatigue. When done over the course of the school year, this process helps students to identify and process their emotions, reflect on their experiences of school life, better understand the dynamics of their class, and encourages students to envision themselves as part of the classroom community. Moreover, Bloomsights adaptive survey technology ensures that school staff always have a real time view of their school's climate and the well-being of their students.

Bloomsights Response Analytics

All student responses are automatically analyzed based on the most current scientific social and emotional development research. The results are delivered to school staff in real time and organized using a three-tiered approach: Class, Student, and Category. Some examples of data analytics offered by Bloomsights include a breakdown of student responses by question, student survey results by category, and individual student responses compared to class responses as a whole.

Bloomsights interactive sociogram provides schools with an at-a-glance view of the underlying social dynamics found in their class and with their students. This makes it easier for school staff to identify early signs of social isolation, bullying, and other barriers to learning and well-being.

The sociogram uses a formula that calculates the number of connections each student has and the strength of those connections and then graphs each student accordingly. School staff can filter the sociogram to show new connections, one-way connections, and two-way connections. Additionally, Bloomsights visualizes the strength of each connection to help school staff better understand each student's social circle.

All data collected directly from students within the Bloomsights platform is authorized through informed, unambiguous, user consent.
