Evaluation Methods Used:

The Candid Color Systems websites were evaluated using Chrome and Edge on a Windows 11 desktop computer. Assistive technologies used in this evaluation included NVDA (screen reader) and the Windows screen magnification function as well as exclusive use of the keyboard to navigate and operate the site content and functionality.
